Safety Committee Phase 1 Update: Installation of the church video monitoring system which was approved by the congregation in our November meeting has begun. Initial exterior camera coverage has been better than anticipated. System should be operational soon. The film laminate installation has been delayed due to outdoor temperatures. The laminate installation needs 55 degrees or warmer for success. Installation will take place as soon as temps rise.


2020 Surplus Funds:

The Lord has blessed Eternal Shepherd once again with a surplus of funds over our actual expenditures in 2020! Our new treasurer, Bill Smith is reconciling our 2020 financials to ensure that surplus numbers are accurate. Our finance team led by Jim Zwahlen has identified target areas to utilize the surplus. We anticipate meeting with the congregation in the February/March timeframe to propose surplus funds expenditures.

2020 Attendance:

Many members of our congregation have not been able to attend worship services due to COVID related risks. God has blessed us with technology that allows remote attendees to participate and worship in the safety of their homes or wherever they may be. Additionally, since our services are streamed to the world-wide internet and available for viewing at any time since they're hosted on-line, friends and family members anywhere in the world can worship with us remotely whenever they wish. Using this technology, we have expanded our reach beyond Seneca, SC. Using our in-person worship numbers and extrapolating our internet based replays, our overall attendance numbers for 2020 are slightly higher than 2019. The Lord continues to bless Eternal Shepherd!

Control. Power. Independence.

Three things humanity loves. Three things that Man seeks after. Three things we place above all else. Three myths passed down from generation to generation, reaching all the way back to the beginning. Myths of the modern age, of man, that sing their siren's song to lure us astray, to seduce us into believing they are ours to own and subdue.

In our never-ending search for the ultimate fulfillment, we buy into the lie that we, you and me, can achieve these things. That we can, under our own might and strength, have total control over ourselves, who we are, and who we claim to truly be. That we can gather and exercise power in order to fulfill our innermost desires to have control over ourselves in the way in which we desire to have them done. And, finally, to have all of this wrapped up nicely in a bow of independence. No one else shall dare question one's own utter, total independence.

Sound familiar? Sound selfish? I hope it does. And it is not simply an accusation towards some rather than others. It is an accusation of us all. You. Me. Everyone is guilty of self-centeredness. Everyone puts themselves first. This myth of total independence is the complete opposite of what we hold to as Christians, and it has been flowing freely since the Garden.

The first sin, the lie believed that broke the world's back, was that created Man could be like the Creator God. Control like God. Know like God. Oh, how little did Adam and Eve truly know. From that moment forward until this very day, humanity has drunk deeply from that cup of false control and independence.

Sin is so deeply entrenched within us that we are blind to just how deep it really goes. Without outside interference, we quickly turn inwards and think only of ourselves. Without someone to save us from ourselves, the world is dark and hostile, yet bids us come and taste all its vaunted delights.

He[God the Father] has delivered us from the domain of darkness and transferred us to the kingdom of his beloved Son, in whom we have redemption, the forgiveness of sins. ... And you, who once were alienated and hostile in mind, doing evil deeds, he[Christ] has now reconciled in his body of flesh by his death, in order to present you holy and blameless and above reproach before him, ... (Colossians 1:13-14, 21-22)

Think about the ESLC Prayer Shawls just as you would a drive-thru restaurant where you get prepared food. The prayer shawls are ready for you to give. There may not be drive-thru service, but they are readily available for you to give to friends or family members that you know are distressed in some way. The recipient does not need to be an ESLC member and any ESLC member can give one. No approval is needed.

If you are praying for someone and feel that they would benefit from this loving and prayed over gift, please do not hesitate to select one to give. There is an ample supply. In times like this, we would like to see more people receiving them. We all know that God will hear our prayers whenever and wherever we pray, but sometimes when one is ill or in a difficult situation, it is nice to have a tangible object for assurance. We like to think that just as the prayer shawls provides bodily warmth, that our Lord and Savior will provide the spiritual warmth needed.

Prayer Shawls are available in a self-service kiosk in the Fellowship Hall by the closets. There are four plastic bins that contain prayer shawls that you may give. Select the one that you like, sign the prayer shawl log showing your name, the date, and the person that you are giving it to. If you give the prayer shawl in person, we request that you pray for them as you are giving it.

A list of those that have already been given prayer shawls is listed on the sheet just underneath the log sheet. We have given four so far in January.

FEEDING THE CHILDREN

We at Eternal Shepherd are sponsors for two schools in Haiti - Pas Bonbon and Rocky Road. Each day we provide the meals for the students and staff, roughly 300 meals a day. The chart below was the projected number for the year, and it has increased by over 10%. This chart is only for the Central Plateau of Haiti. I encourage you to go to the Trinity Hope Website to see how incredible this program is. 33,000 children are fed each day in the Haiti Christian Schools at 25 cents per meal. (www.trinityhope.org) Based on a school year of 180



days, we will provide 54,000 meals to the children of our two schools. Last year we donated \$9,000.00 from our excess funds, which equated to 36,000 meals, the balance came from our Mission Committee budget and individual donations. In addition, last year we supplied the financial resources to cover the staff salary of Pas Bonbon, the boys & girls restrooms at the Rock Road school, Luther's Small Catechism in both French and Creole and over 1,000 fruit trees that are already showing substantial growth. We are making a huge difference in the lives of these children and their families through the schools and the adjoining churches.

If you know of a sister LCMS congregation willing to help support our schools through Trinity Hope, please let me know. I will be more than happy to do a presentation on this awesome ministry in Haiti. (Lars.Helland@edgewaterautomation.com 706-244-4544.

Appreciation**




Sometimes we forget to show love and appreciation to people who are closest to us. Use this fun craft to let everyone in your family know how much you care.

6. Notice the changes in your family when everyone feels loved and appreciated!


