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Staffing Toward the Future

Every time I pray for all of you, I always pray with joy, because of your fellowship in the gospel from the first day until now. Philippians 1:4-5 EHV

A Little History:

Over the past several years we've had a variety of discussions about additional staffing here at Eternal Shepherd. Some of those conversations took place in Council or board meetings but many occurred in hallways and parking lots. Some of those exchanges centered on your concerns that Deaconess and I would have any added support that we might need while others considered what additional ministry could be accomplished by extra hands as we might grow.

Last year, in a congregational meeting it was moved and passed by the ESLC voters that we should investigate additional support staffing. That process began slowly because we knew that Celeste was soon to retire from her position as Office Manager and our focus was on getting Terri trained as the short-term solution followed by the search process that led us to Denise. Along the way, we said farewell to Michelle as our accompanist and saw the usual ebb and flow of Little Lambs teachers from year to year. In short, the Lord led us through a whirlwind of staffing changes over the past year or so.

Now, with those staffing needs settling down, we've turned our attention back to the ministry support that was in view when the congregation voted to investigate additional staffing. We also promised earlier this calendar year to provide an update this summer, which is what this report is providing.

The Promised Staffing Update:

Throughout the past year and more, conversations have continued with the Council & Council President, Elders & Head Elder, and the Board of Outreach with Deaconess and I adding our own ideas of what type of additional staffing might best serve ESLC.

The consensus has been that a second pastor will give us the greatest flexibility and options for growth. An associate or assistant pastor can assist with current preaching and teaching needs as well as visitation, counseling, and funeral and other services. Additionally, a called pastor could also help us to expand our ministry if we should look toward a mission plant or new church effort.

(This is a longer conversation for another day but can be noted briefly here: Synod in convention this summer again encouraged its congregations toward church planting. Our sister church Immanuel Lutheran in Simpsonville is taking up the challenge and our own history as a mission plant out of Abiding Savior invites us to consider such a path. More, we've had some preliminary conversations with Lutherans in Easley that may provide ESLC with an opportunity to do ministry expansion in that area in the next year or so.)

Again, that's another conversation for later but the point as it relates to our staffing plans is that we will need more pastoral support if the Lord leads us toward any sort of expanded ministry or a church plant.

Finally, we are also keeping an eye toward the future of ESLC's own pastoral coverage. If we assume that the Lord leaves me here to continue serving at ESLC, I may have up to another decade of service ahead but at some point, I may be ready to step back into a supporting role and allow someone else to serve as a senior pastor. Obviously, those kinds of future details are in the Lord's hands but it doesn't hurt for us to consider the longer-term needs of Eternal Shepherd and to say with James, "If it is the Lord's will, we will live, and we will do this or that" (4:15).

A search for a full-time, experienced pastor, yet who is younger than me could give us the most flexibility of ministry options moving forward. The Council has voted to establish a call committee toward this end, and we anticipate providing a further update on progress at the Fall congregational meeting. Pray that the Lord would lead us and bless us!

I am convinced of this very thing: that he who began a good work in you will carry it on to completion until the day of Christ Jesus. Philippians 1:6 EHV

While we have much to celebrate at Little Lambs Preschool over the past 25 years, our focus now turns to the next 25 years and beyond. Our vision is to create an environment that attracts more young families, strengthens our preschool ministry, and supports the future growth of ESLC.

To help make this vision a reality, we have reached out to other ESLC Boards and discovered that many of our goals align with their priorities. Together, we have shared ideas about what young children, teens, and young adults are looking for in outdoor spaces and recreational activities.

Did you realize that ESLC has more than 16 acres right here on our campus? With so much space and a blank slate for possibilities, we began asking, “**What if?**”

- What if we had a large, level area for volleyball, children’s soccer, or the increasingly popular game of gaga ball?
- What if we created a pavilion with outdoor tables where we could host our annual church picnic right here on campus?
- What if expanded outdoor spaces provided opportunities for games and activities during VBS?
- What if we had a fire pit with Adirondack chairs where our teens could gather on Sunday evenings for fellowship, Christian conversation, and S’mores?

- What if the small playground had a durable rubberized surface where young children could safely ride tricycles, along with chalkboards mounted on the fence where budding artists could create with washable chalk?

These are just a few of the possibilities. Little Lambs Preschool plans to spearhead a committee to develop a campus-wide master plan for outdoor spaces and activities. The plan will be implemented in several phases, allowing us time to make our campus a welcoming place for children, families, and the entire ESLC community.

Where We Begin

The small and large playgrounds are now 25 years old and need updating to meet current safety standards, as well as the need to bring in new equipment that will truly engage today’s young children. We will begin with the small playground by leveling the ground and improving drainage, installing a durable rubberized safety surface, and adding a shade canopy.

I asked her where she knew me from and she said from the Cancer Center when we visited her with Seth four years ago. When she told me her name, I immediately remembered her, but I couldn't believe my eyes since the last time I saw her, she had no hair and looked pale due to chemotherapy. Now her beautiful curly hair had grown in, she had good color and she looked like the picture of health. We hugged each other like old friends who have not seen each other in a while.

Looking back on the first day of her chemo 4 years ago, which was on a Monday, I remembered how nervous and anxious she was. We brought Seth over for her to pet and she smiled as she petted him. Eight weeks later we were blessed to be there when she rang the bell at the completion of her chemotherapy infusions.

We meet about every two months depending on the number of cars the cutters can prepare.
